

The role of the Supervisory Committee is to make sure the credit unions financial records are in order, the credit union is operating in a safe and sound manner, and is compliant with federal regulations.

In addition to operational oversite, the Committee engages GBQ Partners LLC to perform the Annual Financial Audit and Quarterly Reviews as required by our regulator, the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA).

GBQ determined that all 2021 accounts and records were in order and certified that the financial statements accurately reflect PTFs financial position.

PTF remains financially sound and well capitalized.

This strong position ensures the credit union continues to qualify for federal share insurance through the National Credit Union Share Insurance Fund (NCUSIF).


