We also grew our assets to over \$211 million. When you add that to the 599 community volunteer hours and our 40 hours of member education, it made it one of our strongest years ever!

We have always strived to be the bond of our entire community by helping our membership, our business members, and our community partners throughout Delaware County. 

Soup Crawl is a fun and festive local culinary celebration that benefits Second Harvest Food Bank's The Big Idea initiative. Soup Crawl attendees can stroll the streets of historic downtown Muncie and sample delicious soups from downtown and area restaurants, caterers, and organizations.

The money raised during Soup Crawl supports Second Harvest's Big Idea initiative. The Big Idea initiative invites families to visit their child(ren)'s school once a month to engage with their teachers and staff. At the same time, they receive food and information or services from other essential community resources.





Supervisory Report

The Supervisory Committee is comprised of four volunteers.

The role of the Supervisory Committee is to make sure the credit union's financial records are in order, the credit union is operating in a safe and sound manner, and is compliant with federal regulations.

In addition to operational oversight, the Committee engages GBQ Partners LLC to perform the Annual Financial Audit, Member Account Verification, and Quarterly Reviews as required by our regulator, the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA).

GBQ determined that all 2022 accounts and records were in order and certified that the financial statements accurately reflect PTF's financial position. The final report was completed on December 22, 2022. The report was reviewed by the Supervisory Committee on January 4, 2023 and presented to the Board of Directors on February 21, 2023.

The NCUA performed their periodic Examination as of June 30, 2022 and presented their report to the Board of Directors on November 15, 2022.

PTF remains financially sound and well capitalized.

This strong position ensures the credit union continues to qualify for federal share insurance through the National Credit Union Share Insurance Fund (NCU-SIF).
